At home?

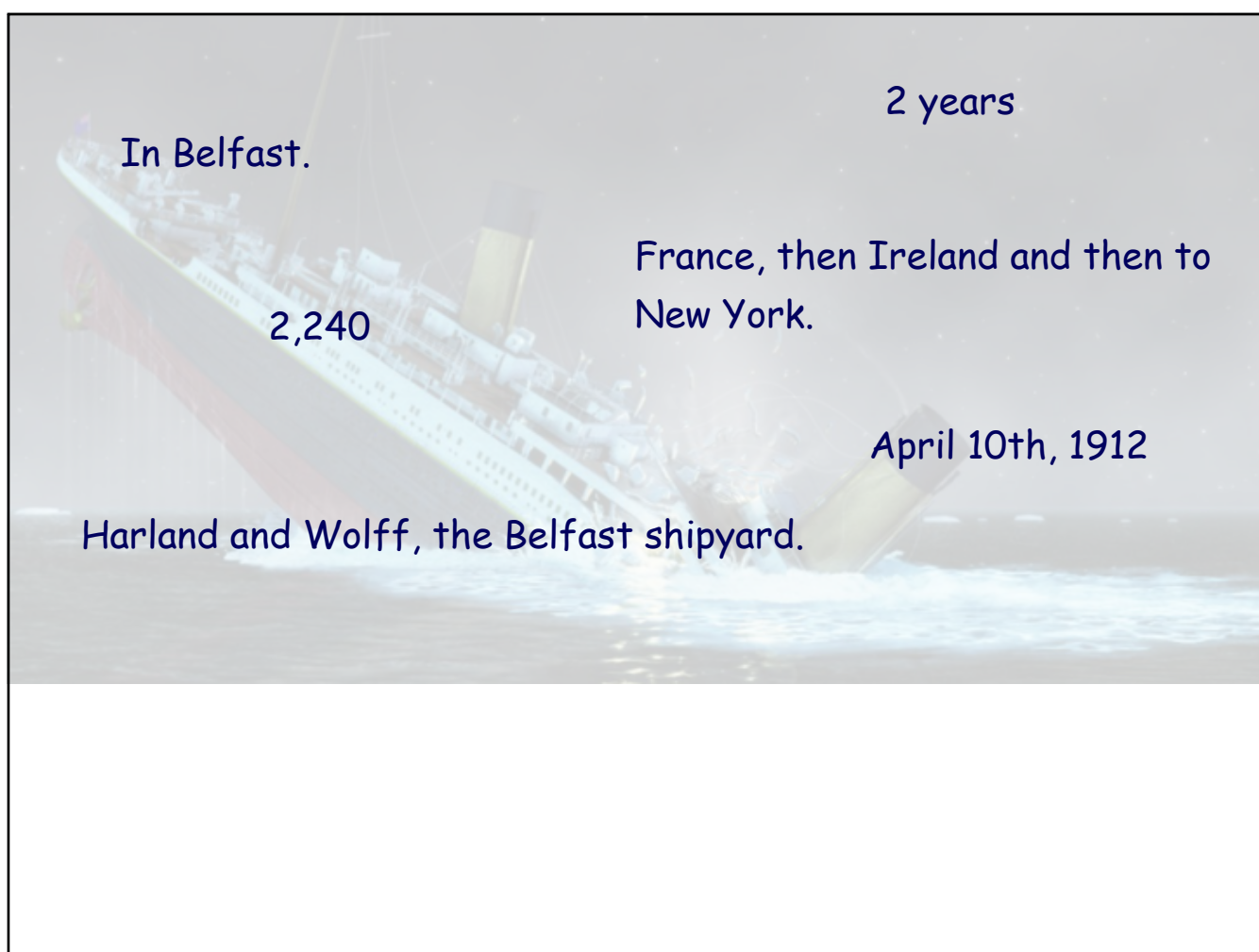
Ask an adult what they know and where they got their information from.
