Class on the Titanic

- On the Titanic, first class and third class passengers were kept separate within their own areas of the ship.



First Class

- First class passengers usually came from the Upper Classes. The Upper class tended to live in large spacious homes in the country with lots of valuable paintings and furniture. They did not have to work. They had servants to do the work for them.

First class on the Titanic

- First class passengers on the Titanic had their own 'suites' of rooms with a living room, bedroom and dressing room.
- In the evenings they could go to the bar and dine with the captain. They could also play tennis, squash and use the gym.




Third Class Passengers

- Third class passengers came from the Working Class.
- As the name suggests they had to work for a living often for little money whilst living in poor conditions. Many were illiterate and often died before they were fifty.

- Many working class people went on the Titanic to start a new life in America in search of the 'American Dream.'
